

What is the 3 1 1 rule on Frontier Airlines? Always Here

The 3-1-1 rule [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) on Frontier Airlines refers to the **TSA (Transportation Security Administration) liquid policy**, which Frontier [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) follows just like all other U.S. airlines. This rule [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) applies to **carry-on baggage only** and is designed to maintain airport security while allowing passengers [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) to bring limited liquids onboard.

The “3” [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) in the rule means that **each liquid, gel, aerosol, cream, or paste must be in a container that holds no [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) more than 3.4 ounces (100 milliliters)**. Even if [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) a bottle is only partially full, if the container itself is larger than 3.4 ounces, it is **not allowed** in your carry-on bag [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#). Common items affected by this rule include [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, lotion, perfume, liquid makeup, gels, and sprays.

The “1” [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) means that all these small liquid containers must fit into **one single, clear, quart-size plastic bag**. The bag must be transparent [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) so TSA officers can easily see what’s inside. [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) Each passenger is allowed **only one quart-size bag** [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) of liquids in their carry-on. If your liquids do not fit into one bag, you will be required to remove items or place [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) them in checked luggage.

The final “1” [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) means **one bag per passenger**. You must take this quart-size liquids bag out of your carry-on and place it in a [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) screening bin when going through TSA security. [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) This helps speed up the screening process and reduces delays at the checkpoint.

Frontier Airlines [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) strictly enforces TSA rules at the airport. If you bring liquids that violate the 3-1-1 rule in your carry-on, TSA will [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) confiscate them, and Frontier will not be responsible for lost [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) items. This is especially important because [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) Frontier travelers often try to pack light to avoid baggage fees, making correct liquid packing even more critical.

There are [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) a few exceptions. **Medications, baby formula, breast milk, and medically necessary liquids** are allowed in larger quantities [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#), but you must declare them to TSA officers during [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) screening. These items may be subject to additional inspection.

To avoid [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) problems when flying Frontier, it’s best to **pack larger liquid items in checked baggage** or buy travel-size containers. [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) Solid alternatives, such as bar soap [⚡ 1_855_510_5815](#) or solid deodorant, are also great options for carry-on travelers.

In summary, **the 3-1-1 rule on Frontier Airlines** means liquids must be **3.4 ounces or less**, fit in **one quart-size clear bag**, with **one bag per passenger**. Following this rule helps ensure a smooth and stress-free security experience.
